Theatre Network Australia (TNA) is a National Centre member of ASSITEJ International. TNA's role continues a 45+ year relationship with the global association.

TNA is the leading national industry development organisation for contemporary small to medium and independent performing arts in Australia.

We strengthen artists and arts organisations; influence cultural policy; facilitate critical debate; and advocate for a more robust, interconnected and innovative sector.

Our membership encompasses theatre, dance, circus, hybrid work, theatre for young audiences and youth arts organisations - those working with young people as the makers of performance. TNA delivers national advocacy, research and communications across each of the states/territories.

Theatre Network Australia believes in the central role that creativity plays in a society. We want a diverse and fair performing arts sector, which puts First Nations people first. We value independent artists, small to medium companies and large organisations and we want greater interconnections between them. We believe in life-long learning. We support different models of working, and we value flexibility. We want fair pay and conditions for our sector. We know that risk and experimentation are important. And we want ongoing, respectful but challenging conversations that connect us, open new ideas, and lead to a stronger sector.

ASSITEJ Australia

The Australian sector has played a leadership role in the ASSITEJ community for over 45 years and has a lot to offer in the current climate. We have hosted two World Congresses: the 9th Congress (Adelaide, 1987) and the 16th Congress (Adelaide 2008).

Our Australian representative, Sue Giles, is a Vice President of ASSITEJ, and Theatre Network Australia is the national centre member for ASSITEJ Australia, advocating for and supporting the promotion of the Australian TYA and Youth Arts sector internationally.

ASSITEJ Australia is a network of artists and companies making work by, with and for young people. It is not limited to Theatre for Young Audiences, but also encompasses those working in Youth Arts and with young people as the makers of performance.

Based in cities, towns, and sometimes very remote communities, the companies and artists making TYA work across Australia are as diverse as the communities they represent. (For example, one of our member companies is responsible for servicing 30,000 square kilometres – an area the size of some European countries!) Distances in Australia can present unique challenges, but also ensure we remain resilient and creative in the way we collaborate, imagine and present work.

Australia's isolation from global practice has a major impact on the perception others have of our work and practice, on what is possible and on our particular challenges and discoveries. On the whole, Australian practitioners take more risk than many others in the world. We have the ability to jump where others hesitate and our appetite for experimentation means that we are fearless when it comes to new form and multiple arts practice.

Australian artists and companies are resilient and creative in the way they collaborate, imagine and present work.

The Australian Theatre for Young Audiences and Youth Arts sector is a body of artists, companies and organisations driven by a passion for young people and children as audiences, participants, creators and experts.

We make work by, with and for young people — embracing a different paradigm that places children and young people at the centre of change.

For decades, our sector has consistently 'punched above its weight' – demonstrating vibrant and innovative approaches to creation and survival. Energy and experimentation are effortless parts of our practice. We are a pro-active, nimble, inventive and resilient sector. We understand our audiences and communities deeply and we understand and advocate for the importance of shifting the perceptions that surround young people and the arts.

Australian work is recognised and critically acclaimed internationally. This sector: tours extensively and often; represents the wider arts sector nationally and regionally; works with and for young people who have limited access to arts and culture; works with an eye for social impact and preventative action; works inclusively; is committed to excellence and rigour across creative processes and outcomes; and consistently demonstrates its value.

This booklet shows the breadth of the work created in Australia and demonstrates our perspective, unique energy and mode of working. It is designed to celebrate what this sector has achieved and to showcase where we are going. Our aim is to capture and promote Australian work so that our international colleagues may be inspired to foster relationships and collaborations with our dynamic sector.
